



Knibb Victorious at T100 San Francisco

Sunday, June 9th; San Francisco, CA - The T100 Triathlon World Tour matches 20 of the world's top male and female triathletes in a series of eight 100K races around the world. Each race comprises a 2000m/1.2 mile open water swim, an 80K/49.7-mile bike, and an 18K/11.2-mile run. At the second stop on this year's tour in San Francisco last weekend (the first was in Miami on March 9th), the NYAC's Taylor Knibb romped to an almost four minute victory, claiming, along with it, the \$25,000 first place prize. Knibb crossed the line at 3:38:01 with Kat Matthews (GBR) second in 3:41:48 and Laura Philipp (GER) third in 3:45:07. After coming out of the water 23 seconds behind leader Imogen Simmonds (SUI), Knibb gained ground on the 80K bike portion and quickly assumed the lead. Of the race, Olalla Cernuda of World Triathlon wrote, "By halfway into the bike course, Knibb's lead to second-place Kat Matthews (GBR) was over 2 minutes, the Brit clearly positioning herself as the best of the rest. [...] With impressive pace for an athlete considered a swim-biker just a couple of years ago, Knibb continued to dominate once she'd laced up her running shoes, lapping athletes over 4km behind her on the course. Behind, Matthews was running with her usual aplomb while Emma Pallant-Browne (GBR) picked off a couple of places in a fleet-footed performance. Facing no threat to her maiden T100 victory, Knibb took in the crowd's adulation on her way to a 3:38:01 finish, earning 35 points and \$25,000." Click here for full results from San Francisco. Knibb will compete in both the triathlon and the cycling competition at the Paris Olympic Games. Joining her on the



US triathlon team will be NYAC athletes Morgan Pearson, Taylor Spivey, Kirsten Kasper and Seth Rider. The men's Olympic triathlon will take place on Tuesday, July 30th at 2am EST; the women's race will be on Wednesday, July 31st at 2am EST. The mixed team relay will happen on Monday, August 5th at 2am EST.

Track and Field - Winger Comes Out of Retirement, Wins at NYC Grand Prix



Saturday, June 8th - Sunday, June 9th; NY, NY - Legendary NYAC javelin thrower Kara Winger, 2022 world champion and four-time Olympian (2008-2020), came out of her retirement this past weekend and won the women's javelin competition at the NYC Grand Prix at Icahn Stadium on Randall's Island with a mark of 63.22m/207-5. NYAC teammate Maggie Malone-Hardin placed second with 59.93m/196-7. Winger's next competition will be the US Olympic Trials, taking place in Eugene OR from June 21st to June 30th, and at which she hopes to qualify for her fifth Olympic team. In addition to placing among the top three throwers at the Trials, Winger also has to reach the Olympic qualifying standard. Other NYAC highlights from the NYC Grand Prix included Daniel Haugh's (77.76m/255-1) and Rudy Winkler's (77.23m/253-5) first and second place finishes in the men's hammer throw. Additionally, **Sam Mattis** placed fifth in the men's discus with a season's best mark of 65.49m/214-10, and Janeah Stewart took sixth in the women's hammer throw with 65.50m/214-11. Wrestling - NYAC Wrestlers Contest UWW Ranking Series Budapest

Thursday, June 6th – Sunday, June 9th; Budapest, Hungary – NYAC wrestlers Darian Cruz (57kg FS), Bekzod Abdurakhmonov (74kg FS) and Adam Coon (130kg GR) contested the Polyak. Imre & Varga Janos Memorial Ranking Event last weekend. Cruz, currently ranked 30th, and Abdurakhmonov, ranked 37th, advanced to the guarter-finals before being defeated. Adam Coon, currently ranked 32nd, was eliminated in the qualification round by #4-ranked Abdellatif Mohamed of Egypt. Click here for full results from Budapest. The NYAC's Cruz and Coon, with Sarah Hildebrandt (50kg WFS), will contest the Paris Olympic Games this summer. Hildebrandt, a Tokyo 2020 50kg bronze medalist, is currently ranked #6 in the world. Wrestling will take place at the Paris Games from Monday, August 5th to Sunday, August 11th, the day of the Closing Ceremony
